

BWC & OIC Budgets in Brief

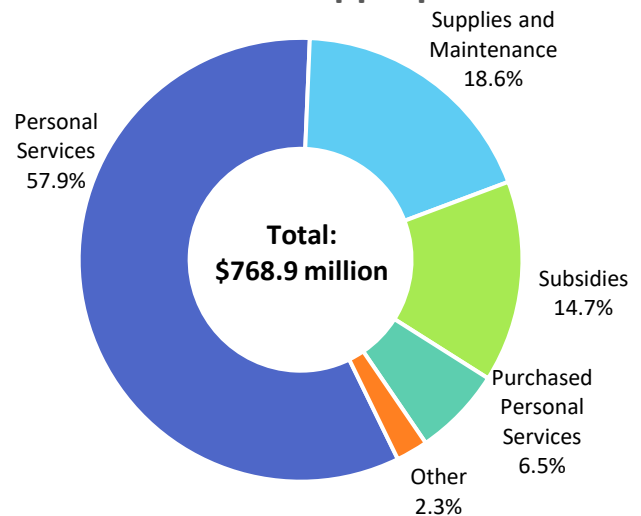
H.B. 81 and H.B. 80 – As Enacted

- R.C. 101.532 requires the Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) and the Ohio Industrial Commission (OIC) each have its own budget bill, separate from the main operating budget bill.
- BWC and OIC budgets receive no General Revenue Fund (GRF) funding. They are primarily funded by administrative assessments charged to employers. A small portion of the BWC budget is supported by federal grants.

Bureau of Workers' Compensation

- BWC is governed by a board of directors who, along with the Administrator, are appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.
- BWC provides workers' compensation insurance to all public and private employers except for those who qualify for self-insurance.
- In FY 2024, BWC covered almost 259,000 Ohio employers, paid about \$1.27 billion in benefits, and approved over 66,000 new claims. Most claims are paid from the State Insurance Fund, a trust fund that is not part of the state treasury and that is not subject to appropriations by the General Assembly.
- The largest spending category for BWC is personal services, which accounts for 57.9% of BWC's budget (H.B. 81) for FY 2026 and FY 2027. BWC had a state employee headcount of 1,553 as of June 2025.
- H.B. 81's subsidy appropriations include, in each fiscal year, \$41.3 million for Safety Grants, \$14.2 million for the Safety and Health Workforce Safety Innovation Center, and \$1.0 million for other safety programs.

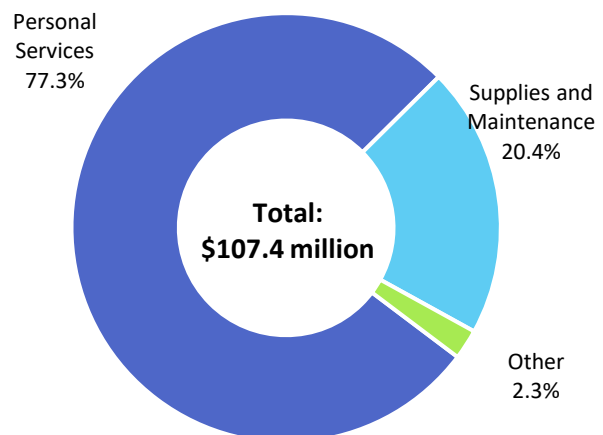
H.B.81 BWC Appropriations



Ohio Industrial Commission

- OIC is governed by a panel of commissioners who are appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.
- OIC adjudicates disputes in the workers' compensation system.
- The largest spending category for OIC is personal services, which accounts for 77.3% of OIC's budget (H.B. 80) for FY 2026 and FY 2027. OIC has a state employee headcount of 292 as of June 2025.
