## EdChoice Expansion Scholarships

FY 2024

- Provide state funding to pay tuition to a chartered nonpublic school
- H.B. 33 changed the program beginning in FY 2024:
  - All K-12 students are eligible, regardless of income. Formerly, only students whose family income was up to a certain threshold (most recently, 250% of the federal poverty level, or FPL) were eligible for new scholarships
  - Scholarship amounts are means-tested

**LARGEST** of the state's five scholarship programs:

59% of all participants

42% of all payments

H.B. 33's changes to EdChoice expansion scholarship eligibility resulted in significant increases in participation and state payments.

## EdChoice Expansion Scholarship Payments and FTE Participants, FY 2021-FY 2024




The program pays 100% of the scholarship to families with incomes up to 450% FPL and phases down the amount paid to families with higher incomes


Share of New EdChoice Expansion Participants (Headcount) by Previous School Type, FY 2024



The "Other" category mainly represents kindergarten students, but also includes students who were homeschooled, new to the state, or previously attended a nonchartered nonpublic school.

Students with family incomes up to 450% FPL (those eligible for the maximum scholarship) make up 47% of participants but 64% of payments
