## State Foundation Aid

- Ohio's largest source of state support for public schools
- Distributed by formula to traditional districts, joint vocational school districts (JVSDs), community schools, and STEM schools
- Mostly based on enrollment, district property values, and district income

## **State Share of the Base Cost**

Determines a per-pupil local contribution then requires the state to make up the difference to bring the total up to a perpupil base cost amount that varies by district. The formula provides a higher state share per pupil to lower wealth districts.

## **Targeted Assistance**

Generally, additional state aid to school districts with lower capacities to raise local revenues and small school districts with relatively low total property and income







Core Foundation Aid

The formula is subject to a phase-in mechanism. Most components are phased in at 50% in FY 2024 & 66.67% in FY 2025


Core foundation aid = FY 2020 funding + [Phase-in % x (New formula - FY 2020 funding)]

Lower wealth districts receive more foundation aid per pupil than higher wealth districts






Foundation Aid by School Type, FY 2024
