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Motor Vehicle Registration Cost

State law requires payment of certain taxes and fees when registering a passenger car. The registration costs paid by a passenger car owner consists of the base annual license tax (\$20), an additional registration application fee (\$11), an alternative-fuel vehicle fee (which varies depending on the type of vehicle and applies only to certain vehicles), a deputy registrar fee (\$5), and a local motor vehicle tax (which varies from \$0-\$30 depending on the taxing district). Fees also apply for a new license plate, and there is an annual fee for a county identification sticker to be placed on a license plate. Because of the variability of some of the taxes and fees, individual passenger car owners will pay different amounts to register their vehicles depending on where they live, the type of vehicle, and whether new license plates are purchased.

The Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) in the Department of Public Safety (DPS) is responsible for registering vehicles throughout the state. The vast majority of these vehicles are passenger cars. A passenger car is any motor vehicle that is designed and used for carrying not more than nine persons, and includes any motor vehicle that is designed and used for carrying not more than 15 persons in a ridesharing arrangement. According to DPS, nearly 9 million passenger cars were registered in Ohio in 2023.

Annual passenger car registration cost

The general taxes and fees for registering a standard passenger car powered only by an internal combustion engine are specified in Table 1 below. The taxes and fees for registering alternatively fueled passenger cars are specified in Table 2 below. The fees for issuing one license plate are specified in Table 3, and the fees for issuing two license plates are specified in Table 4 (note: Ohio requires only one license plate, but a person may purchase two). Additional fees may apply in nonstandard circumstances, including those highlighted in the footnotes of this memorandum. Additionally, the fees listed below are for a single-year registration. Passenger car owners have the option of registering their vehicles for multiple years, up to five years. In that case, the owner generally pays the single year fees multiplied by the number of years the car is being registered.¹
