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OHIO LIQUOR PERMITS

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The liquor control laws govern the sale of beer, wine, mixed beverages, and spirituous liquor in Ohio. The primary regulatory mechanism utilized by the Division of Liquor Control¹ to regulate these sales is through the issuance of permits. Permits are divided into classes, depending on whether the applicant is a manufacturer, distributor, or retailer. The retail sales permits are further divided depending on whether a permit holder is authorized to sell beer, wine and mixed beverages, spirituous liquor, or a combination of any those alcoholic beverages for consumption on or off the premises where the beverages are sold. The tables below describe all of the permits currently issued by the Division.

For purposes of the tables, references to the individual drink refers to an alcoholic beverage that is served either in a glass (for example, glass of wine or mixed beverage) or a can or bottle (for example, an opened bottle of beer). An original container refers to the container that a manufacturer uses to distribute an alcoholic beverage (for example, a bottle of wine or a sealed bottle of beer).

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Ohio Liquor Permits

Consumption on premises refers to the consumption of an alcoholic beverage on the premises of a permit holder. Consumption of premises refers to the consumption of an alcoholic beverage away from the permit holder's premises. An example of off-premises consumption is the purchase of a bottle of wine for consumption at a person's home. "Intoxicating liquor" includes all liquids and compounds, other than beer, containing 0.5% or more of alcohol by volume (ABV). "Wine" generally is intoxicating liquor made from fermented grapes, fruit, or other agricultural products that contains 0.5% to 21% ABV. "Mixed beverages" are products that contain whiskey, neutral spirits, brandy, gin, or other distilled spirits containing 0.5% to 21% ABV. "Spirituous liquor" includes all intoxicating liquors containing more than 21% ABV.²

In addition to sales specified in the tables, an A-1, A-1-A, A-1c, A-2, A-2f, A-3a, and D class (other than D-6 and D-8 permits) permit holder may sell alcoholic beverages to go in sealed, covered cups along with a meal for off-premises consumption, including via delivery.³
